Representative Matters

Participated in defending a community of faith involving claims of childhood sexual abuse. Favorable settlement during jury trial.

Jury trial of an admitted liability transportation law matter. Plaintiff claimed that a low-speed impact caused him to suffer from a traumatic brain injury and other personal injuries. Favorable verdict for defendant.

Bench trial of an admitted liability transportation law matter. Plaintiff claimed that a low-speed impact caused her to suffer from debilitating personal injuries. Favorable verdict for defendant.

A former Catholic seminarian from Mexico who was engaged in a ministerial placement alleged that he was owed overtime pay for work he performed. The U.S. District Court dismissed his claim, concluding it as barred by the ministerial exception. Prevailed on judgment on the pleadings. The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit affirmed.
